Global Design Initiative 2.0 returns to map cultures, spaces and communities. Mapping as an analytic tool, allows perspectives of reality to be visually communicated through images, graphs, classifications, text, art, sounds, drawings, installations, etc. At GDI 2.0, participants will be introduced to *gigamapping* to critically examine hawker cultures in Singapore and design unique narratives around the central role of food in society. These cartographies can be reflective, experimental and/or speculative. Using *gigamapping* as method, GDI 2.0 participants will study the critical link between artists/designers and systems-thinking to deeply examine interrelated networks of design issues, concerns and tendencies. Participants will look beyond objects and solutions through the visualisation of the future.
